The first grade is made by 5 questions which weight 2 points each and one 5 , total weights 15 . From the example above you can understand that 28.7 is obtained as $(30 * 2+30 * 2+20 * 2+30 * 2+30 * 5+30 * 2) / 15$ The second weight is made by two 2 points questions, plus one 3 and one 4.

From the example above $\left(30^{*} 3+27^{*} 4+27^{*} 2+28^{*} 3\right) / 12$ which give 28 .
The final grade is the first grade weighted 14 , the second again14 and the paper weighted 2.
The extra points and the laude $L$ are used to refine the grade if they are above the average if they are below that suggest not to raise the grade.
